News:

Newcastle is reopening! We want to thank all of our families for their patience as we navigate a new hybrid instructional model. We realize that this plan is not the perfect solution for all of our community's needs however we will continue to work together towards additional phase-in plans extending the in-person school day and number of days in school of in-person instruction as we receive updated guidance from CDE, CDPH, and/or local health authority and Placer County Office of Education.

Please read the reopening information below very carefully.

Safety: As part of our safety protocols, staff will conduct daily health monitoring and communicate their health status as established by the district. To ensure student health, families are required to conduct daily health monitoring of their child/children prior to sending them to school. FAMILIES MUST COMPLETE THE STUDENT HEALTH SCREENING FORM BELOW AND SEND THE COMPLETED FORM WITH EACH STUDENT ON THE FIRST DAY OF IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION.

Supplies for Hybrid Instruction:

Due to COVID, we will not be sharing instructional supplies. Teachers are communicating the supplies needed for those students returning to in-person instruction. In addition to class supplies we are asking families to provide the additional materials:

- 2 personal face masks (1 to wear and 1 as a back-up)
- personal refillable water bottle (water fountains are turned off but filling stations and class faucets are available)
- **beach towel** (for outside learning allowing students to socially distance)
- non-aerosol sunscreen (optional students may not share sunscreen)
- hat for sun protection during outdoor learning + play (optional)
- Snack
- earbuds/headphones (as age appropriate and as directed by your child's teacher - not required by all grades)

Cohorts:

Cohort A: In-person instruction on Mondays and Tuesdays

Cohort B - In-person instruction on Thursdays and Fridays

Cohort C - 100% distance learning instruction. All families who let us know that they will remain in distance learning are in Cohort C. For planning purposes, all children were placed in either Cohort A OR Cohort B for if/when they return to school. Families will alert the school if/when they will come out of Cohort C to re-enter school for in-person instruction in their assigned cohort.

While we would prefer families to stay in either the hybrid cohort model or the distance learning model, families may make arrangements through the office to change from one model to the other as appropriate for your family's needs. We will work together on a smooth transition. To ensure student and staff safety, and to maintain the integrity of each cohort, we will not be making changes to your student's cohort placement.
