CAASPP Testing: All students in grades 3-8 will be taking the CAASPP test April 27 - May 7 from 8:00 - 10:15. This is an annual assessment that measures student achievement in language arts, math, and science in grades 5 and 8. C Cohort students in grades 3-8 will receive communication from Mrs. Graham to review testing options. Students have been preparing for the past few months and are comfortable and familiar with the process. This assessment will be shorter in length than previous years due to COVID. Classrooms will be ready with snacks and incentives. We encourage students to get plenty of rest, eat a healthy breakfast, arrive on time, and be prepared with a charged Chromebook if applicable.

California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) is an anonymous, confidential survey of school climate and safety, student wellness, and youth resiliency. We will be administering it to students in grades 6 and 7 on April 29th (date moved back). It enables schools and communities to collect and analyze data regarding local youth health risks and behaviors, school connectedness, school climate, protective factors, and school violence. The CHKS allows us to focus on improving the school climate and the student learning environment for overall school improvements.
