**CAASPP Testing begins this week!** All students in grades 3-8 will be taking the CAASPP test April 27th - May 7th from 8:00-10:15. This is an annual assessment that measures student achievement in language arts, math. Students in grades 5 & 8 will also take the California Science Test (CAST). Our PTC will provide a daily snack. We encourage students to get plenty of rest, eat a healthy breakfast, arrive on time, and be prepared with a charged Chromebook if applicable.

**California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS)** The CHKS will be administering it to students in grades 6 and 7 only on April 29th. All 6th and 7th grade families should have received an email with details about the survey. Any parent wishing to opt their child out of taking the survey needs to complete the Opt Out form and submit it by THIS MONDAY, 4/26.
