CAASPP Testing continues this week! All students in grades 3-8 will continue taking the CAASPP test May 4th - May 7th from 8:00-10:15. This is an annual assessment that measures student achievement in language arts, math. Students in grades 5 & 8 will also take the California Science Test (CAST). Our PTC has graciously provided daily snacks. We encourage students to get plenty of rest, eat a healthy breakfast, arrive on time, and be prepared with a charged Chromebook if applicable.
