Important COVID Updates - The health and safety of our students and staff is our top priority! With an increase in COVID cases, and with state and county guidelines changing, please know that we are making every effort to ensure the safety of our students and staff while still being able to provide quality, in-person education. As we become aware of cases and/or potential exposures, you will be notified via our school communication system IF your student has been directly affected. We understand that CDC and CDPH have released their quarantine guidance however, as a district we are working with the <u>Placer County Health</u> <u>Department</u> to determine our quarantine protocols. We thank you in advance for your patience as we work through the processes and guidance. Like you, we are anxiously awaiting clear and consistent implementation of the safety protocols.

In the event of an exposure, you might consider registering your student in advance for school-provided COVID-19 Rapid Testing. *Only students that have opt-in registration will be able to access the school-provided COVID Rapid Test. This is optional for our school families and no student will be tested without the consent and registration by their parent/guardian.* To pre-register in the event you'd like your child tested, click the following link and select "Student Registration" https://my.primary.health/l/newcastle-elementary. All questions included in registration are required for California State public health reporting. This program is free for all participants.

PUHSD Open Enrollment - 2022-23 OPEN ENROLLMENT PERIOD FOR PLACER UNION HIGH

SCHOOL DISTRICT (PUHSD) Open Enrollment/Intradistrict applications for Placer Union High School District are being accepted between January 4th and January 31st, 2022. The District's Open Enrollment/Intradistrict Transfer policy may allow students to attend a school outside their normal area of attendance provided there is space available and the deadline is met. TO APPLY: The parent/guardian of the pupil must complete and submit the application, along with the most recent copies of grades, attendance, and notice of any behavior issues to their school of residence and request an appointment with the principal. The completed form MUST be turned into the District Office no later than January 31, 2022, by 3:59 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS. Applications can be found on our website. COVID Safety - We must continue to be diligent about the health and safety of our students and staff. It is imperative that students DO NOT come to school if any of the following are true:

Exhibiting COVID symptoms

Exposure to a positive COVID-19 person

Exposure to a person waiting for test results

Exposure to a person experiencing ANY COVID symptoms

Symptoms include: Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea

Per CDPH guidance, all persons regardless of vaccination status, are required to wear masks while indoors. This includes all school visitors. Masks are not required outside. Here is a CDC resource on how to properly wear, remove, and clean masks: <u>CDC Guide to Masks</u>

COVID Resources - Please know that we are working hard to understand the ever-changing guidelines while keeping student and staff safety at the forefront of our decision-making and communications. <u>HERE</u> is a resource from Placer County that may be helpful.

Absence Reporting: If a student is absent from school, <u>the reason for the absence must be reported on the day of the absence</u>. When reporting an absence please provide the following information: student's name, date of the absence, the reason for the absence, and the relationship of the person reporting the absence.

There are three (3) ways to report an absence to the school:

- 1. Call the office attendance line at (916) 663-3307 then press 3 and leave a message after the beep.
- 2. Email the school office staff.
- 3. Submit using our website Absence Reporting Tool.

If verification of a student's absence due to illness has not occurred within three (3) school days, the unverified absence will be recorded as unexcused. Per state education code, after three days, an unexcused absence cannot be changed. If a student is absent for 3 or more consecutive days a doctor's note is required. Students with excessive tardiness, absences and/or habitual truancy may be referred to SARB. The following are the only legal excuses that will be accepted by the office for absences and tardies as outlined in Education Code 48205: 1) Personal illness; 2) Quarantine under the direction of the county or city health officer; 3) Medical, dental, optometric or chiropractic appointments, court appearance; 4) Attendance at funeral services; or 5) Participation in religious exercises or to receive moral and religious instruction in accordance with district policy. *Family trips/vacations are unexcused absences unless an Independent Study contract is granted. Please contact your child's teacher or the school office at least five school days in advance of a trip, regarding Independent Study.*

Campus Traffic - Please follow the Car Pick Up Guidelines below:

- Do not arrive before 1:30 on Mondays and 2:30 T-F into the school parking lot. This will allow the TK/K families with no other children to enter the upper parking lot by the flagpole, pick up their child(ren), and exit before the regular dismissal time.
- ONLY TK/K parents <u>with no other students</u> may arrive early on campus. TK and Kindergarten parents who do <u>NOT</u> have upper-grade students (grades 1-5) should arrive AT 2:10 and depart BEFORE 2:30. <u>Again, do not arrive early and park in the pick-up line as you also back up traffic</u>.
- Families with TK/K students AND upper-grade students (grades 1-5) should pick up ALL of their children in the lower circle at 2:30 or after (1:30 on Mondays).
- Our neighbors are respectfully asking that you do not block their driveways for extended periods of time so that they can also get in and out.
- For the safety of all of our families, <u>please do NOT make illegal u-turns</u>, <u>park in undesignated areas</u>, <u>and go the wrong way on the streets</u>.
- Lower Campus PCOE has asked us to put out a reminder for parents to please NOT drive or park on the lawn areas (lower campus road and oof the side of the parking lot) while waiting during pickup.
- Upper Campus Parents please DO NOT drop off students in the Placer County Office of Education Medical Therapy Unit (MTU) parking lot by the TK/1st classrooms. This is NOT a designated drop-off area for students as these parking spots are for the employees/patrons of the PCOE MTU.
- Again, please DO NOT ARRIVE EARLY for pick-up as it causes unnecessary traffic backup
