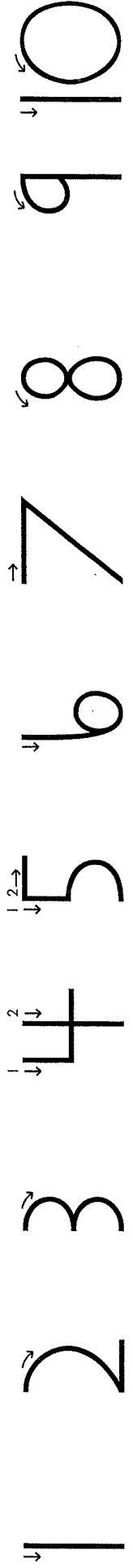
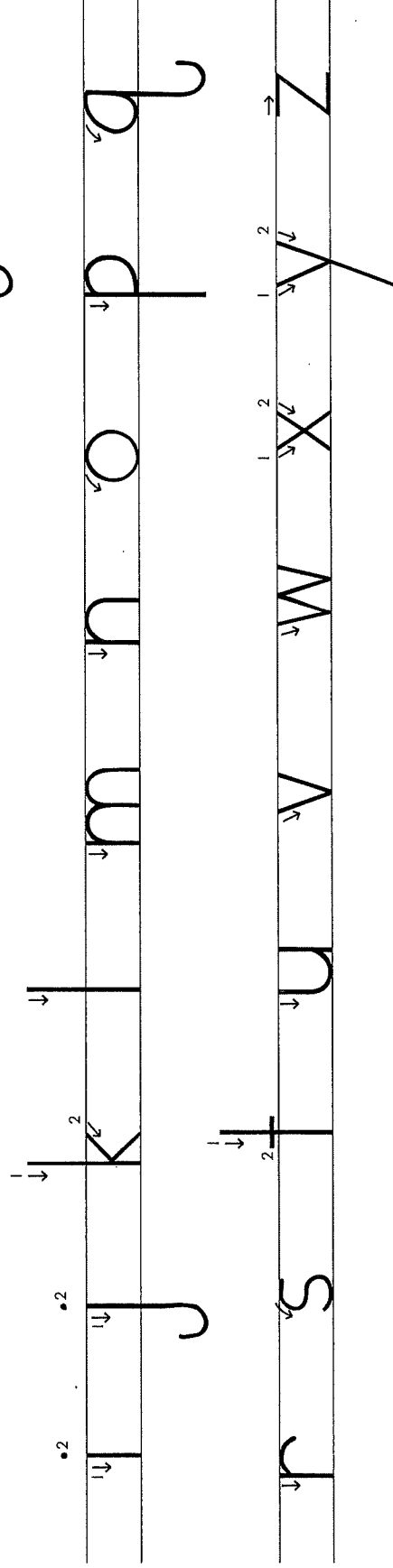
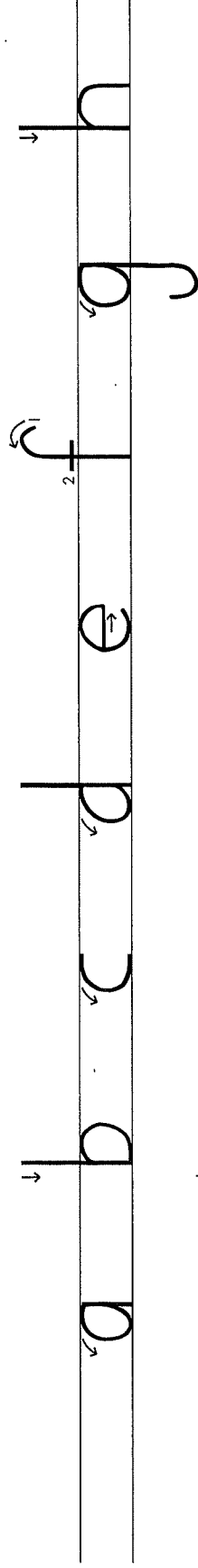
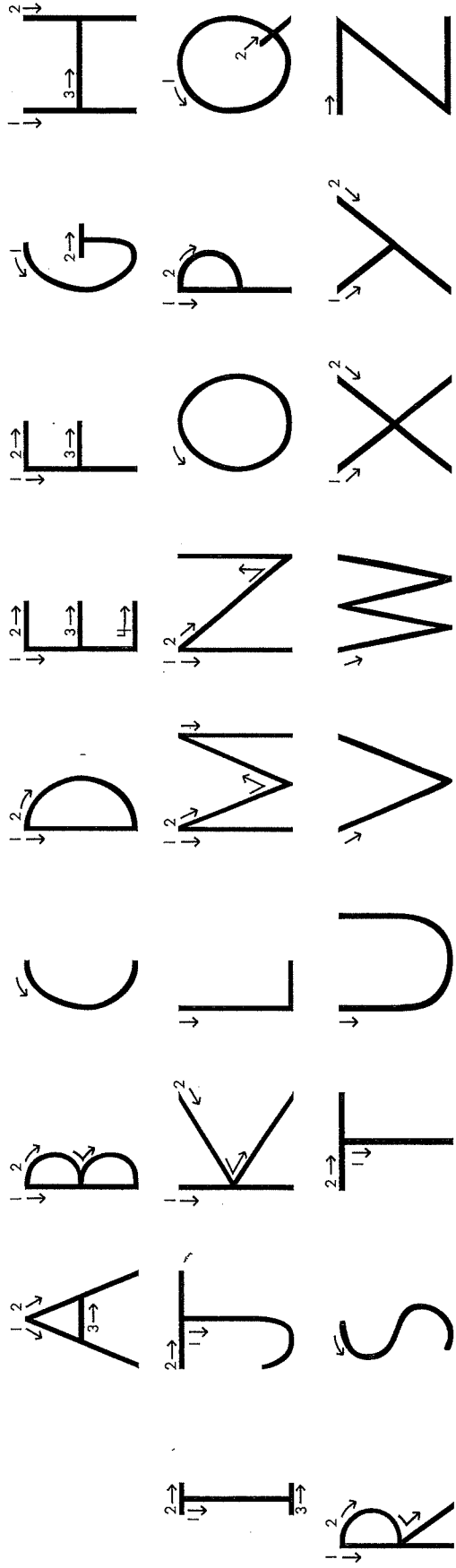
Other Optional Activities:

- Draw a picture or write about the things you like to do during summer

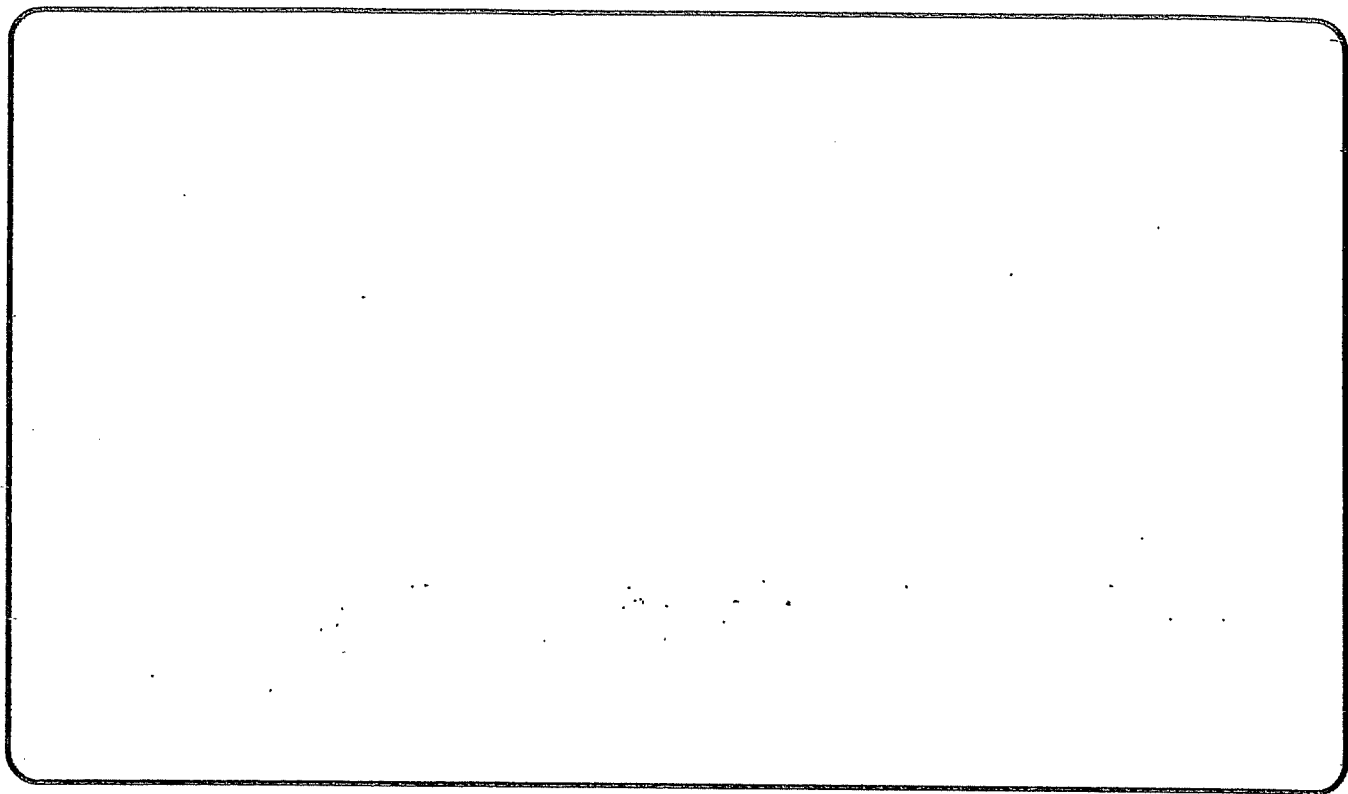
